# SACRED HEART NEWS

We celebrate this Fourth Sunday of Lent God's love and mercy. Even though we are not faithful and loving with God all the time, He is still searching for opportunities to show us His love, mercy, and kindness.

One of the most popular verses from the Bible says: "God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world." God created us to make us beneficiaries of His love but also INSTRUMENTS OF HIS LOVE for others. God wants to save us and to love us all the time.

This weekend's readings remind us of God's love, compassion, and patience. And the first two readings speak to us about that...God doesn't reject us, does not judge us. God sees us so different from the way the world and people see us.

Saint Paul tells us in such a powerful way: the Lord is so rich in kindness and mercy. He has an immense love for all of us. Where others see sin and imperfections, God sees a restless person, a lonely person, a person hungry for love and mercy.

The story of Nicodemus teaches us great lessons:

1. We need a personal experience with Jesus in our lifetime and especially around Lent so we can choose to be like Him.
2. Like Nicodemus, we sometimes choose to live in the dark. He was ready to meet Jesus, but Nicodemus was not ready to commit himself to Jesus. That looks like our faith and our personal history: we know Jesus, but we are not committed to Him.
3. Anytime and any season is the perfect time to accept Jesus and to welcome Him into our lives.
4. A lot of times we need to be more proactive in our life and relationship with Jesus. What steps are we talking to get closer to Jesus and to change our lives around us?
5. We can rest in Jesus' presence at night. We can spend time with Jesus and then we can wake up refreshed and alert.
6. "The fact that Nicodemus went to Jesus by night suggests he had questions about his life, and life purpose that would not leave him alone. Rather than burn the midnight oil studying the law, he desired to see Jesus who was the fulfillment of all the OT prophecies." *I wonder what kind of questions you might have for Jesus every day...*
7. *Jesus offers to Nicodemus what the law and studies brings to people, JESUS BROUGHT TO NICODEMUS "GRACE."*

Finally, the story of Nicodemus invites us to reflect on a basic question: ARE WE LIVING IN LIGHT OR DARKNESS?

Nicodemus chose Jesus through his personal CONVERSION.

Even the most religious person needs a new birth, a new start, a fresh start, a NEW CONVERSION. And conversion means to choose Jesus the TRUE LIGHT. Amen!
