SACRED HEART NEWS

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

We are embracing the celebrations of Holy Week after hours, days, and weeks of preparation. How is your faith arriving during Holy Week? How is the heart arriving during Holy Week?

I hope your prayers and sacrifices helped you to acknowledge the importance of preparing ourselves properly for Holy Week. It is important to remember that from Palm Sunday until Easter morning, we have plenty of opportunities to slow down, contemplate and meditate on the Mysteries we are celebrating.

Holy Week is about reflecting on love, mercy, and a sacrifice made for us and for our salvation. Pope Francis said: "God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire of seeking his mercy."

I would like to encourage you to open your hearts and receive God's love and mercy during Holy Week. Then we can help Him to spread His love and mercy towards others. Pray for those you don't get along so well. Pray for those we struggled to forgive in our lives and our families.

One of my favorite quotes from Fulton Sheen says: "Show me your hands. Do they have scars from giving? Show me your feet. Are they wounded in service? Show me your heart. Have you left a place for divine love?"

Have we hardened our hearts this year? Let us ask ourselves: Do I have a hard and cold heart?

Maybe spending time with Jesus Thursday evening can help you to realize how much you need Jesus in your life. Maybe walking and offering the stations of the cross you might experience the invitation to help Jesus by helping someone to carry his or her cross. We need more people who help others like Simon the Cyrene to carry their burdens and their cross.

What to do during Holy Week?

- 1. Pray & participate. Take "prayer breaks" each day. Participate in the celebrations.
- 2. Practice humility and patience every day this Holy Week.
- 3. Make a small sacrifice every day.
- 4. This year, pay special attention to Good Friday.
 - Join us for the morning prayer and the powerful stations of the Cross.
 - If possible, fast in any way possible.
 - If possible, take TIME OFF. We sacrifice for concerts, games, movies, parties, family reunions, Christmas parades, picnics, sports, and useless conversations with gossiping involved. Why not sacrifice half a day or the whole day for Jesus?
 - Offer a prayer of gratitude for the SACRIFICE JESUS MADE FOR YOU AND ME.

We are trying to bring the community together in a spiritual way and we will be doing morning prayer together.

Holy Week is not only about remembering events. Holy Week is about embracing those events with faith, hope, joy and gratitude. It is allowing Jesus and the message of His passion, death, and resurrection to transform us.

Let us walk with faith during the Triduum. Let us accompany Mary to Calvary. Let us embrace the moment when the stone is going to be rolled for us. Let us witness in a different way the power of the EMPTY TOMB for us today.

Have a blessed and truly HOLY WEEK.



Holy Thursday Bread Blessing and Exchange

Some years ago there arose at Sacred Heart the custom of parishioners bringing homemade or special bread to the Mass of the Lord's Supper. The bread was blessed during the Mass and distributed randomly to parishioners as they departed. Over the last few years participation in this practice has declined dramatically. Few parishioners bring bread, most of those who do bring ordinary grocery store sandwich bread, and it is difficult to get parishioners to take a loaf home. It appears this custom no longer has the significance it once had.

Parishioners are encouraged again to bring special bread on Holy Thursday. The loaves will be blessed and distributed at the end of our celebration. If participation this year follows recent trends, it will be a sign that it is time to let go of this custom.

Palm Sunday: Trusting the Lord



WORK OF MERCY: Forgive Injuries

THE GRACE I SEEK: to trust that Jesus is with me and is transforming my life even in my suffering

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze.

Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to trust you even when I am suffering.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"The LORD God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame." (Isaiah 50:7)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

Identify an area of your life where you feel shame or humiliation. Give this to the Lord, and ask how he wants to take away your disgrace. How does he want to be your "help" in the midst of this suffering, just as Isaiah says?

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.

"When the great crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they took palm branches and went out to meet him, and cried out: 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the king of Israel.'" (John 12:12–13)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

Coming into Jerusalem, Jesus was met with enthusiasm by those who would soon petition for his death. However, he wholeheartedly forgave them all on the Cross. Identify one person in your life whom Jesus is inviting you to forgive. Offer this person to the Lord in a concrete way, asking for the grace to unite your pain with his own pain on the Cross.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — Almighty ever-living God, who as an example of humility for the human race to follow caused our Savior to take flesh and submit to the Cross, graciously grant that we may heed his lesson of patient suffering and so merit a share in his Resurrection. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Palm Sunday)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire to unite your humiliations and pain with the Lord's in his sacrifice on the Cross.

LOVE IN ACTION — Many saints and spiritual writers have encouraged an examination of your day, each day, as a central part of the spiritual life. It is not only a way to see how the Holy Spirit is moving in your life and how well (or not so well!) you are responding, but it is also a beautiful opportunity to forgive those who may have hurt you in some way. Try working an <u>examen</u> into your daily routine, and make it a way to forgive any hurts or injuries others may have inflicted on you throughout the day so you can live in greater freedom and peace.




