SACRED HEART NEWS

HAPPY EASTER EVERYONE!

We celebrated that OUR LORD JESUS WAS RISEN FROM THE DEAD. Jesus' Resurrection is for all of us who believe in HIM. The Resurrection is for those stranded, defeated, lonely, neglected, judged and condemned because of their past, hopeless. fearful, and abandoned. JESUS IS FOR ALL OF US, AND ESPECIALLY THOSE IN NEED OF A MOMENT OF FAITH, JOY, HOPE AND STRENGTH IN THEIR LIVES. Embrace and enjoy this glorious moment in your life.

EASTER reminds us that nobody and no power cannot stop God's plan of salvation for all of us. It reminds us that even though our lives are so imperfect, Jesus our Lord can change us and make our lives so worth it.

The power of the Resurrection is the main pillar of our faith and our spiritual journey. We believe and follow a RISEN LORD, not a defeated God. Even though we are so imperfect and so unfaithful, God's love and faithfulness overcame death and a tomb. The tomb and a giant stone couldn't stop from searching for us and our hearts. Neither our big nor small sins can stop the celebrations of EASTER SUNDAY.

I found a phrase that says:

"Resurrection does not have meaning for us IN SPITE of our wounds. Resurrection has meaning for us BECAUSE OF our wounds."

We are children of the Risen Lord. We are called to experience the Resurrection in our lives and to show signs of how the Resurrection can change us.

My first semester as a priest was tough and I struggled to be accepted and loved by a few people. There was a man in particular who showed me many times I was not good for him and his family. They rejected me, they harassed me, they made fun of my English and my background. I was so hurt and so frustrated. I started praying and praying for him and his family. I survived my first year dealing with them.

EASTER 2019...To my surprise on Easter Sunday he walked into the sacristy before the Spanish mass, got on his knees, broke into tears, and apologized to me. It was my best Easter gift ever!

HIS WORDS WERE: "I WAS WRONG! YOU ARE SUCH A GREAT MAN AND A WONDERFUL PRIEST. PLEASE FORGIVE ME." He attended the Spanish Mass for the first time in his life. He invited me to his house for dinner and we have been good friends since that day. He was so delighted I came to his house.

Until today, I believed the Risen Lord changed his mind and heart on Easter Vigil. He was "resurrected" from his anger, judgmentalism, criticism, and fear of acceptance. He used to call me FATHER TACO TUESDAY. After his personal "RESURRECTION" he started calling me FATHER PACO. No doubt, the RESURRECTION CAN CHANGE OUR LIVES.

Then I reflected, how do we promote the Resurrection and the Risen Lord if we have not experienced first-hand in our own lives. The signs of the Resurrection in your life are not shown in your body. The first sign is our daily death to those things that separates us from Jesus and from our families and community. We must be ready to die for Jesus and to our sins.

Remember we believe in the Resurrection, and we should preach a RISEN CHRIST.

May the joy and HOPE of Easter remain in you and your family forever! HAPPY, BLESSED AND JOYFUL EASTER.







Sacred Clothes

During Mass various cloths are used with the chalice. The Purificator is used to wipe the rim of the chalice after someone receives the Precious Blood and to dry chalices after being purified after Communion. Because they have contact with the Precious Blood, before laundering they are soaked in water so that it no longer has the attributes of wine and ceases to be the Blood of Christ.

Next is the Pall. A stiff piece of linen, usually two layers with a piece of cardboard between and placed on top of the chalice. Originally used to keep flies from getting into the Precious Blood.

It provides a stiff square over which the Chalice Veil, if being used, can be draped for ceremonial purposes.

Easter Sunday: Seeing and Believing



THE GRACE I SEEK: to recognize the power of Christ's Resurrection in my life

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze.

Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to see that you can bring life out of death and that you seek to make all things new by your Resurrection from the dead.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead." (Acts 10:39b–41)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

How can you allow Jesus to put to death anything in your heart that prevents you from trusting God and his plan of love for your life? Ask Jesus to help you deepen your communion with God and become an even more effective witness to the transforming power of his Resurrection!

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow these words of to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.

"When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed." (John 20:6–8)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

How can you exercise the gift of faith in every area of your life, trusting completely in God's plan for you? How is Jesus inviting you to leave the "tombs" of your past so that you can walk in greater freedom during this Easter Season?

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — O God, who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray, that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Easter Sunday, Mass During the Day)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire to radiate the light of the Resurrection. Ask for a deepening of Christ's grace so you can be his light for others.

LOVE IN ACTION — During Easter, we are called to be instruments of new life for all our brothers and sisters, especially through choices of love and solidarity. May each of us leave the tombs of our doubts and fears so that we can help meet the spiritual and material needs of others, especially through our prayers, offerings, and acts of charity and accompaniment, which are powerful channels of grace for all hearts.
