SACRED HEART NEWS

We celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. First, I would like to thank everyone for the prayers, support and assistance during our Advent and Christmas seasons. I think it was a remarkable year and we tried our best. I am open to any ideas or recommendations for this new year so we can have spiritual and meaningful celebrations.

I would like to express my gratitude also for the numerous cards, emails, notes, and gifts I received for Christmas. Your kindness and generosity are much appreciated.

Also, I am so grateful for your warmth and welcoming hearts with my family. They enjoyed their visit and asked me to tell you how grateful they are to everyone for your friendship. A BIG THANK YOU!

It is a great celebration in our Church this weekend, THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD. The message is simple, JESUS IS FOR ANYONE AND EVERYONE. It means that Jesus can be revealed in different times, cultures, places, and ways. He is present and we cannot restrict His love and presence to a particular time or culture. Jesus is for everyone and anyone who accepts Him and welcomes Him.

Jesus is revealed and manifested to all of us, but it is up to us to accept His gift. I heard a phrase that says: "UNEXPECTED STRANGERS BROUGHT THE UNEXPECTED."

The Epiphany is so important for our Catholic tradition but also a universal lesson and invitation. It is by reflecting on the star, the magi, and the witnesses that we can get a better sense of what the Epiphany means for all of us. A professor told us at the seminary: LOOK BEHIND THE STAR.

I read an article that mentions this important clue: *"In his book "Jesus of Nazareth: The Infancy Narratives," Pope Benedict XVI observed that it was not the star that determined the child's destiny but the child who directed the star."*

The CCC # 528 says: *"The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world" and that the magi's coming to Jerusalem, in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews, shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be the king of the nations."*

The Epiphany invites us to seek the Lord, to help those in search of Jesus, to adore Him, to bring the gift of yourself to Jesus, and to return changed and transformed after your personal meeting with Jesus.

The Epiphany invites us to search for Jesus constantly and to allow Him to change us. To present ourselves and our brokenness with a humble heart. But I think the most important lesson for us today is that we must follow God's way, God's direction so we can arrive safely to our destination.

Let us ask the Lord to help us to remain focused following the true LIGHT, our Lord Jesus Christ.

Cup of Salvation

The Chalice takes the highest place among all liturgical vessels. Dating back to the Last Supper, when Jesus instituted the Eucharist with the words, “This chalice is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me” (1 Cor 11:25). The chalice must be consecrated by a bishop and made of a hard, precious material, such as gold or silver. If the chalice is not gold, then the inside of the cup which holds the Precious Blood should be gilded. This serves both a practical and a reverential purpose making the chalice not only a worthy receptacle for the Precious Blood, but also prevents the surface from tarnishing and the Blood from soaking into the chalice. These regulations ensure that Christ’s Blood has a vessel which is both practical and worthy.
