Advent is here! Advent is here for you and me, for all of us!

We are opening the door to a new liturgical year, and I would like to invite you and your family to set 3 spiritual goals for this new year within the Church.

A few years ago, I was traveling, and I met by accident a woman who months later became a member of the US Supreme Court. I remember how excited I was meeting her and how overwhelmed I was because she gave me a book with her autograph. Then, the same year ADVENT came, and I challenged myself to be more excited and prepared to meet the Lord. The joy, the spiritual excitement and the preparation for Jesus is very rewarding. IT IS SO WORTH IT TO WAIT FOR JESUS!

ADVENT is such a powerful and spiritual journey with so many good things and opportunities. Typically, we say it is a season of preparation, waiting and warming up our hearts for the celebrations of Christmas. But if we push ourselves harder, we can embrace this new season and new liturgical year with such faith and passion like never before in our lives

I pray and I hope this ADVENT SEASON brings you hope, peace, joy, and a lot of LOVE. There is something you can help me with at the beginning of this ADVENT SEASON. First, let us offer our ADVENT PRAYER every day for ourselves and our parish family. The prayer will be in our bulletin, our website, and social media. Second, let us pray for each other. For every member and every family so many of us will be ready and prepared to welcome BABY JESUS once again.

ADVENT helps us to get ourselves ready to meet the Lord. During ADVENT WE WATCH, AND WE WAIT. But also, we can walk the extra mile for Jesus. It might require from each one of us a little extra effort in prayer, maybe attending an extra Mass, maybe celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation, maybe forgiving someone, maybe making the phone call to a kid or grandkid a little neglected this year, maybe restoring a relationship with a friend, neighbor, or family member. For this time of Advent is a time of waiting for the Lord, who will visit us all on the feast, but also, each one, in our own hearts. The Lord is coming! Let us wait for him!" (*Pope Francis, Angelus, 8 December 2013*).

## **Eucharistic Table**

The Eucharist is consecrated on not merely a table, but an *Altar*. "Christian altar is the symbol of Christ himself, present in the midst of the assembly of his faithful" (ccc 1383). The altar is therefore not a remote and isolated image of Christ, but one standing in the midst of his people. Altars have been present In both the Old & New Covenants. Think of the shapes/sizes/looks of all the altars you have ever seen in your life.

Altar Cloths - The altar is covered with a linen cloth for protection. It can be colored to match the liturgical season or provide decoration and is generally left on the altar except after Holy Thursday when Jesus is stripped of his garments. It is a sign of reverence for the holy place upon which the Body and Blood of Christ is offered. The next cloth unfolded by the priest

is the *Corporal*. It must be white, symbolizing purity and to see small particles of the Eucharist if they fall.

Watch as Father sets the table.

#### INVITATION TO SERVE AS A PERPETUAL PILGRIM

The National Eucharistic Congress, Inc. is excited to invite young people ages 19-29 to apply in service as Perpetual Pilgrims along the four distinct routes destined for the 10th National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN. Joined by a priest chaplain, a consistent group of volunteers is needed to accompany Jesus in the Eucharist from May 17 to July 21, 2024. Perpetual Pilgrims will travel a combined distance of 6,500 miles, stopping at many holy sites along this unprecedented coast-to-coast pilgrimage modeled after the Gospel account of Jesus' journey to Emmaus two millennia ago. **The deadline to apply is Tue., Nov. 28, 2023.** More info is available on the flier on North entrance bulletin board.

#### FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT/SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD

Questions have been asked regarding the Masses for the **Fourth Sunday of Advent** (Dec. 24) and the **Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord**. Please note that the Scripture readings and prayers for the anticipatory Mass on Saturday (Dec. 23) and the Sunday morning Masses on Dec. 24 are taken from the Fourth Sunday of Advent. The Scripture readings and prayers offered on the evening of Sun., Dec. 24 (Christmas Eve) are taken from the Vigil Mass of Christmas OR the Mass during the Night, when the Mass is offered later in the evening. The faithful are reminded that there is an obligation of Mass attendance attached to both the Fourth Sunday of Advent as well as the Christmas Mass (since Christmas itself is a Holy Day of Obligation). In short, a person cannot attend Mass on Sunday evening and have it fulfill the obligation for both Sunday and Christmas. The obligations are distinct from one another.

# UPCOMING SACRED HEART PILGRIMAGE: Dec. 27, 2023-Dec. 27, 2024

This December 27, 2023, will mark the 350th anniversary of the revelation of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Our diocese is blessed with 12 parishes named in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During the 350th anniversary, which begins on the date of the first apparition, Dec. 27, and will conclude next year on December 27, 2024, I encourage all Catholics to grow in their devotion and love for the Sacred Heart of Jesus. On the diocesan Website, you will find a collection of time-honored prayers and resources to encourage and enhance your devotion. In addition, I am encouraging the faithful to make a "pilgrimage" to each of the 12 parishes. The Office of Communications has partnered with the Office of Faith Formation to create a kit for the 12 parishes, which includes a stamp, prayers to pray during your visit, and Sacred Heart devotionals. A "passport" for this purpose can be easily downloaded from the Website, <a href="here">here</a>, or it may be clipped from the Nov. 24 edition of *The Mirror. Then, with each visit, pilgrims can stamp the "passport" of the parish they are visiting. Once the 12-parish pilgrimage is completed, simply mail the passport to the Office of the Bishop, and I will send them a gift, along with a certificate of completion.*






